Pray that he intercede for you. They say that the saint to whom we have prayed in a special manner during life will assist us very closely at death. May it be Saint Joseph!

Further questions to consider:

Have I surrendered the prospect of my death, or the death of a loved one to God's will? Do I fear death? What can I change in my life to help me achieve a holy death?

Action Item:

Say this prayer tonight: "Dear St. Joseph, please intercede for me at the hour of my death, that I may be treated with mercy and not what I deserve. Stay with me and guide through my life that I may become holy like you."

Daily Prayer:

Be mindful of us, O blessed Joseph, and intercede for us with thy foster-Son by the pleading of thy prayer: do thou in like manner render the Blessed Virgin Mary, thy Spouse, gracious unto us, for she is the Mother of Him, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns world without end. Amen. (Memorare of St. Bernardine of Siena)
